Bios

Isabelle Romieu



Dr. Isabelle Romieu obtained her Medical degree (MD) from the Medical School of Montpellier in France and worked for several years at a Cancer Institute in France. She holds a master of Public Health (MPH) and doctorate of Science (ScD) in Epidemiology from Harvard University.

She previously worked for the Pan American Health organization, then with the National Institute of Public Health in Mexico where she was professor of epidemiology. She was later employed at the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) as Head of the Section on Nutrition and Metabolism and currently visiting scientist at IARC. She is the PI of a large Mexican cohort study (EsMaestras cohort study) and has previously been co-PI of the European Prospective Investigation into Cancer and Nutrition (EPIC).

Dominik D. Alexander



Dr. Dominik D. Alexander has a PhD in epidemiology from the University of Alabama-Birmingham School of Public Health where he was awarded a National Cancer Institute Fellowship in Cancer Prevention and Control. In addition, he has a M.S.P.H in Epidemiology and Biostatistics from the University of South Florida where he focused on advanced quantitative methodology. He is a Principal Epidemiologist at EpidStat Institute, Ann Arbor, Michigan. Since 2015, he has been part of the editorial board of the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition. Dr. Alexander has extensive experience in health research methodology, meta-analysis, and disease causation, particularly in the conceptualization, design, analysis, and interpretation of epidemiologic studies.
